About Housing Pathways

Housing Pathways is making it simpler, fairer and easier for people to apply for and be matched with housing assistance.

Previously, if you applied for housing assistance, you had to lodge an application with Housing NSW and community housing providers. Each organisation had their own waiting list and if you wanted to change your details or find out where your application was up to, you needed to contact each organisation.

To make this process easier and fairer, Housing NSW, and 25 community housing providers worked together to set up one application system under Housing Pathways.

Now, you are able to fill out a single application form to apply for housing owned by Housing NSW, participating community housing providers or Aboriginal housing owned by the Aboriginal Housing Office.

You are able to choose who you would like to provide housing assistance to you and, depending on who you selected, you may get an offer of housing from either Housing NSW or a community housing provider.

A single statewide waiting list called the NSW Housing Register has been created. This register includes all clients on the Housing NSW waiting list and participating community housing provider waiting lists.

When you go to or contact any Housing NSW office or any office owned by these participating organisations, you can find out where your application is up to as all participating housing providers can now access the same system.



What is a community housing provider and how is this different to Housing NSW?

Community housing provides affordable rental housing to around 18,000 households on low-to-moderate incomes across NSW. The NSW Government has made a commitment to grow community housing so there are 30,000 homes by 2016. This means you have more choice to apply for housing with different providers and through Housing Pathways, you are able to do this through one application process.

Housing provided by Housing NSW and community housing providers is very similar. They both offer secure, affordable, long-term rental housing for people on low incomes who need a home, but community housing is generally managed by not-for-profit organisations. The homes are either owned by the government or rented from private landlords with government funding.

Community housing providers have similar policies to public housing but there are some key differences:

- some community housing providers allow their clients to select more than one location when applying for housing

- the length of lease (tenure) offered can vary. Some community housing providers offer continuous leases unlike public housing that offers two, five or ten years depending on your circumstances
- some community housing providers may charge a small bond at the start of your tenancy.

If you would like further information or have specific questions you will need to check with the particular provider in your area.

Who are the participating community housing providers?

There may be one or more housing providers offering housing in most towns and all cities and major centres in NSW. A list of participating community housing providers is included in this information sheet or you can contact your local Housing NSW office for further information.

There are some areas in NSW that will only have properties that are managed by community housing providers and there may be some areas where there is only public housing available.

About Housing Pathways

I was on the waiting list with Housing NSW (or on a community housing provider waiting list). What does this mean to me?

Your application has been transferred to the new NSW Housing Register, which can be accessed by Housing NSW and participating community housing providers.

Since 27 April 2010, your personal information (including health information) is shared between participating housing providers so your application for housing can be processed and assessed. Your personal and health information is still subject to the same level of protection under privacy legislation as it is now.

However, you can only be made offers of housing by participating community housing providers if you have already told us you wish to be considered for community housing.

If you are not sure whether you have done this, or you want to make this change to an existing application, please contact your local Housing NSW office and they will help you do this.

Who will look after my application for housing and my future housing needs?

You are able to contact any Housing NSW office or a participating community housing provider to request any changes to your application. This might be as simple as a new contact number or a change of address.

Where do I go when I have a change of circumstances?

Housing NSW or a participating community housing provider can update your application with a change of circumstances. For example, if your application was originally lodged with Housing NSW but it is more convenient for you to visit a participating community housing provider office, then you can advise the community housing provider about your change of circumstances.

Will I have more opportunities to be housed if I register interest in both public and community housing?

Yes. There are more opportunities to be housed when you have registered your interest in public and community housing. It is very difficult to tell which housing provider will make you an offer as it depends on many factors such as:

- the availability of properties to be offered from public housing and community housing in the area of your choice
- the number of people on the NSW Housing Register that applied for public housing or for community housing in that area.

How do I register my interest in community housing?

You will need to contact your local Housing NSW office or a participating community housing provider to register your interest in being housed by a community housing provider.

Housing NSW letters

You should be aware that, during the initial period of Housing Pathways, some Housing NSW letters may continue to refer to 'Housing NSW' or 'public housing' rather than 'public or community housing available under Housing Pathways'.

What is possible under Housing Pathways

You will be able to contact any Housing NSW office or participating community housing provider to:

- request any changes to your application (eg. new contact number or a change of address)
- find out where your application is up to
- request a transfer.

For example, if your application was originally lodged with Housing NSW but it is more convenient for you to visit a participating community housing provider office, then you can advise the community housing provider about your change of circumstances.

You can now select the housing provider type you wish to be housed with:

- public housing and Aboriginal Housing Office properties through Housing NSW
- community housing
- one or both of the above.
